

The Central to Eveleigh Urban Transformation and Transport Program is about great city thinking that connects diverse and vibrant communities.

What is the Program?

Announced in mid 2013 by the NSW Government, the project aims to progressively transform government owned land in and around the rail corridor for approximately 3 kilometres and includes Central and Redfern stations, Australian Technology Park, Eveleigh Rail Yards and the airspace above railway lines. The program also includes Waterloo and Redfern social housing estates.

UrbanGrowth NSW is working with the community and stakeholders to prepare a long term plan for the area, an urban transformation strategy with a vision, planning and design principles and a delivery framework to guide future development.

Map

The Program covers approximately 80 hectares of mainly under-utilised government land in and around the corridor and considers opportunities for transformation in the context of a wider 500 hectare area surrounding the corridor, known as the study area.

Who is UrbanGrowth NSW

UrbanGrowth NSW is the NSW Government's urban transformation delivery organisation. Our ambition is to transform city living so it is more vibrant, connected and healthy for all.

Through the delivery of world class urban transformation, we aim to maximise the value of government land for the public benefit, improve the amenity and liveability of our urban spaces, and enable the delivery of housing and jobs growth.

To enable a truly global city, we are working with a range of population scenarios to test the possible impacts of growth on infrastructure.

The urban transformation strategy

The urban transformation strategy will drive the future of the corridor, it will be a blueprint for not just what shape the corridor will take, but how it will be progressively achieved over the next 20 to 30 years. When complete, it will guide future decisions on rezoning and development.

We are building the strategy through community and stakeholder engagement, expert advice, and in reference to existing policies for the area including the City of Sydney's 'Sydney 2030' and the NSW Government's 'A Plan for Growing Sydney'.

We recognise the strengths and diversity of the community and celebrate the area's unique association with Aboriginal culture and history.

Shared Vision



Living: This will be a place with a broad supply and choice of homes and active, safe and attractive public places to support social diversity and community connections.



Working: This will be a dynamic and popular place to work – a place that connects many types of businesses and offers the right balance and diversity of service, trade, digital, education, innovation and creative industries.



Environment: This will be a place that responds to economic, social and climatic changes in ways that benefits our quality of life and the quality of our environment - a place that harnesses new opportunities to enrich the community.



Community: This will be a place that builds community by celebrating our rich diversity and heritage and gives everyone easy access to community and cultural facilities.

- 2. Create a green network along the corridor 7. Promote live-work environments

- Connect the corridor with surrounding places and the CBD
- 5. Create centres of community activity around stations

- 6. Create an economic centre of Sydney's growing industries
- 8. Strengthen arts, culture and heritage
- 9. Integrate new high density mixed use buildings with the surrounds
- 10. Deliver a diversity of housing choice and tenure
