Your participation in the Program is important in making sure we get this right. The types of benefits the Program

will deliver include innovative approaches to housing diversity, redevelopment of Redfern Station and new and improved green spaces along the spine of the corridor with better walking and cycle routes. We want both Aboriginal and European heritage to be celebrated and to create spaces that expand cultural and creative activities.

We will need to balance the impact of building heights and traffic while improving the liveability of the area for local communities. The next stage is to ask for your thoughts on our draft urban design and planning principles that will indicate the future outcomes and priorities.

While it's too early to have a firm idea of how many people, or new homes, might be brought into the area over the long term, we are using a range to guide our studies from approximately 8,000 to 15,000 dwellings in the corridor. We are testing a range of scenarios but the results of technical studies will guide our final decision about the scale of future development.







The blueprint for the future

We are developing an urban transformation strategy that will drive the future shape of this part of the city. It will be a blueprint not just for what shape the corridor will take, but how it will be achieved over the short, medium and long term. When complete, it will guide future decisions on rezoning and development applications.

The urban transformation strategy

The strategy will contain:



Transformation

- Shared vision for the corridor
- Case for change
- Clarification of desired benefits and recognition of trade-offs.



Urban design and planning framework

- Key design and planning principles to guide future planning decisions
- Urban strategies for places, networks and neighbourhoods
- A consolidated framework plan and staging for different parts of the corridor.



- Key infrastructure funding methods
- Preferred planning pathways
- Governance framework.

The urban transformation strategy is being informed by a significant amount of technical work and consultation with community and other government agencies including:

- Transport for NSW
- Department of Family and Community Services
- Department of Education and Communities
- NSW Health.
